CONSUMER ALERT: Be Cautious When Purchasing Overthe-Counter Hearing Aids

Attorney General Ken Paxton today warned Texans to be cautious when considering buying from companies selling over-the-counter hearing aids, particularly online or by mail order. Many hearing devices sold this way are not approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and are deceptively marketed as medical hearing devices when they contain low-quality amplifiers.

Texans should remember these tips when purchasing a hearing aid:

- Get a hearing screening and recommendation from a hearing professional who can tell you what type of hearing device will work best for you.
- Remember that over-the-counter hearing aids are not FDA-approved. Some companies will deceptively state that they are "registered" to imply that the FDA has endorsed or approved them. It has not.
- Before purchasing, research the seller with the <u>Better Business Bureau</u>.
 Read online reviews and endorsements skeptically, unless you know and trust the source.
